Gulf States Marine Fisheries Commission  
Gulf of Mexico Marine Aquaculture Pilot Projects FY 2020 Funding Opportunity

The Gulf States Marine Fisheries Commission is seeking proposals to develop potential marine aquaculture projects in the U.S. Gulf of Mexico and the U.S. Caribbean territories targeting shellfish (other than oysters), seaweed, and other relative newcomers to the domestic aquaculture industry.

The Commission is making \$600,000 available for the funding period of February 1, 2020 to January 31, 2021. The Commission plans to award several projects ranging from \$50,000 to \$100,000 each but will give consideration to projects that can justify a greater need. Past awardees with proven success may submit proposals for consideration to continue their work for another year. Any investigator seeking support for this period must submit, as a single file, an electronic proposal by e-mail no later than 5:00 p.m. CST on Thursday, September 19, 2019.
