Departmental Enhancement (DENH)



DENH: Overview



Enhances the infrastructure of academic, research, or agricultural departments/units and promotes economic development.

- Three competition categories:
 - 1. Research for faculty/staff research
 - 2. Education for undergraduate/graduate education
 - 3. Workforce for addressing statewide workforce priorities and needs

DENH: Program Types



Comprehensive

- For projects lasting up to five years
- Max request is \$1,000,000
- Addresses multiple departmental priorities through a variety of means

Targeted

- For projects lasting one year
- Max request is \$200,000
- Focuses on a critical departmental priority through concentrated effort

DENH: Eligibility



- Only faculty members may act as PI or co-PI
- Comprehensive: one submission allowed per unit
- Targeted: no limit; proposals must be ranked by leadership

- Engineering B (Industrial, Materials, Mech) Social S
- Biological Sciences
- Health & Medical Sciences
- Physics

- Social Sciences
- Humanities
- Agricultural Sciences
- Astronomy

DENH: Budgets



Disallowed Items

- Ongoing costs for existing programs
- Equipment repair/maintenance
- Routine renovation

Students

BoR will not pay tuition or payroll benefits

Salary

- Generally not allowed
- 25% of academic salary + 2 summer months

DENH: In Summary



Geared toward departments wanting to increase capacity and quality of research, education, and/or training

- Program Types
 - **Comprehensive**: up to \$1,000,000 over 5 years
 - ► Targeted: up to \$200,000 for 1 year
