**COMPLAINT** (include all important information, i.e. facts, dates, times, witnesses, etc.):

The Plaintiff brings this complaint seeking a Request for Judicial Review for impeachment regarding the conduct of SGA Senator [redacted], pursuant to Section 7.5.2 of the SGA Constitution. On August 31, 2022, the Plaintiff was placed on the Agenda of the SGA Senate for consideration to be appointed to an open Senate seat {Exhibit A}. On August 31, 2022, at the end of the SGA Senate Meeting, during the Open Forum portion, SGA Senator [redacted] made an open comment to the SGA Senate, as noted on page 57 of the Meeting's Minutes {Exhibit B}. During this open comment, SGA Senator [redacted] stated that she is an "addict." SGA Senator [redacted] went on to say that UNO should have more resources available on campus for addicts, like herself, such as having" Narcan" and "fentanyl test strips." It should be noted that Narcan and fentanyl test strips are used by addicts that abuse opioids, such as heroin. SGA Senator [redacted] went on to say in her open comment that there is "nowhere to dispose of dirty needles on campus," used by addicts and diabetic patients. It should also be noted that addicts commonly inject heroin using syringes.

The Plaintiff submits to this Court that SGA Senator [redacted] violated and is in violation of, the SGA Constitution, Section 7.1, Subsection 7.1.3, which states, "And violations of University Policy, the Student Handbook, or the UNOSGA Code of Conduct on campus, or at University (or University related) functions." The SGA Constitution, Section 7.2, lists the UNOSGA's Code of Conduct. Subsections 7.2.5. and 7.2.6., list a series of forbidden acts by SGA officer or officials. Under

these forbidden acts, subsection 7.2.6.4., includes "Illicit drug use. The Plaintiff submits to this Court that SGA Senator [redacted] is a selfconfessed drug addict and user of illicit drugs. Therefore, SGA Senator [redacted] has violated, and is in violation of, the UNOSGA's Code of Conduct. It should be noted that although Subsection 7.2.6., of the SGA Constitution technically states, "conviction of" forbidden acts, including illicit druguse, American and Louisiana jurisprudence does not outlaw illicit drug use. Instead, American and Louisiana jurisprudence outlaws the possession of illicit drugs, such as outlined in Louisiana R.S. 40:966. However, the theory is that someone must first possess an illicit drug in order to then use or ingest an illicit drug. However, despite the technical language contained in the SGA Constitution and the UNOSGA's Code of Conduct, it was clearly the spirit and intention of the UNOSGA and the SGA Senate not to have drug addicts or drug users serving in the SGA Senate, whether they are self-confessed or outed by way of a criminal conviction. Further, it is reasonable and likely for this Court to infer and deduce from her open comment on August 31, 2022, that SGA Senator [redacted] is using and abusing illicit drugs on the campus of UNO. This is why she is asking for Narcan and fentanyl test strips to be available on UNO's campus, along with on campus sites to dispose of "dirty needles" used by addicts.
