Ms. Barthelemy was one of only 19 Ph.D. students chosen from an international applicant pool of 50 to participate in an accelerated Public Policy summer program taught at the University of California, Berkeley by Dr. Philippe Zittoun and Dr. Christopher Ansell (University of California, Berkeley).
