INTRODUCTION

Louisiana Board of Regents prepared the 2022 Board of Regents Teacher Preparation Report as an independent initiative. This initiative aims to make Louisiana's teacher preparation program outcomes available to the public. The report features information about undergraduate and alternative teacher preparation programs, which include public and private university programs. This report contains specific data about teacher preparation program enrollment, completion, retention licensure test pass rates, and performance. Public and private university program providers have signed consent agreements with the Board of Regents and the Louisiana Department of Education to share this information.

Outcome data in the 2022 Board of Regents Teacher Preparation Report pertains to 2019-20 program completers who taught in 2020-21. Retention data have been provided for 2019-20 completers who taught in 2020-21. Moreover, five-year retention data are provided for 2015-16 completers who taught in 2016-17, 2017-18, 2018-19, 2019-20 and 2020-21.

Due to COVID-19, school districts did not conduct Compass teacher evaluations in 2019-20. During this time, Louisiana's public schools did not administer achievement tests. Compass teacher evaluations provide three-year averages for first- and second-year teachers who taught in 2017-18, 2018-19, and 2020-21.

PERCENTAGE OF PROGRAM COMPLETERS PASSING PRAXIS ASSESSMENTS FOR TEACHER LICENSURE

UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMS (COMPLETER YEAR: 2019-20)

On June 18, 2022, Governor John Bel Edwards signed into law a change in requirements for candidates to become teachers. The new law does not require candidates to pass Praxis Core Academic Skills exams to enter a program or to become certified to teach. To become certified to teach, candidates must complete a teacher preparation program, pass a content examination, and pass a pedagogical knowledge examination. The chart below identifies the passage rates of undergraduate completers who took the Praxis Core Academic Skills, Content Knowledge, and Pedagogical Knowledge examinations during the cohort year.

ALTERNATE PROGRAMS (COMPLETER YEAR: 2019-20)

As of June 18, 2022, new requirements were signed into law that require candidates to have a bachelor's degree and pass a content examination to enter teacher preparation programs. Passage of Praxis Core Academic Skills examinations is no longer required. To become certified to teach, candidates must complete a teacher preparation program, pass a content examination, and pass a pedagogical knowledge examination. The chart below identifies the passage rates of alternate completers who took the Praxis Core Academic Skills, Content Knowledge, and Pedagogical Knowledge examinations during the cohort year.

CLINICAL EXPERIENCES FOR TEACHER PREPARATION PROGRAMS

UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMS (COMPLETER YEAR: 2019-2020)

Effective January 1, 2017, the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE) issued a revised policy for institutions to require all undergraduate candidates to complete a one-year residency instead of the previous Student Teaching requirements.

The requirements for one-year residencies found in BESE Bulletin 996 (<u>https://bese.louisiana.gov/policy</u>) are listed below.

Minimum Requirements for Traditional Teacher Preparation Programs:

Programs shall include the following practice experiences, which directly align with and sequentially develop the competencies identified in BESE Bulletin 746:

- 1. actual practice experiences shall be provided in classroom settings prior to the residency year; and
- 2. a one-year residency shall take place in a public or approved non-public school classroom in the certification area with a teacher of record who holds a valid level 1, 2, 3, type A, or type B teaching certificate in the area for which the candidate is pursuing certification in accordance with LAC 28:CXXXI (Bulletin 746).
 - a. beginning July 1, 2018, candidates must hold a valid resident teacher certificate to be placed in a one-year residency;
 - b. for certification in B-K, PK-3, 1-5, or 1-5 integrated to merged, candidates must spend a minimum of 80 percent of the residency school site's instructional time each week engaged in residency activities;
 - c. for certification in K-12, 4-8, 6-12, 4-8 integrated to merged, or 6-12 integrated to merged, candidates must spend a minimum of 60 percent of the residency school site's instructional time each week in the first semester and 80 percent of the residency school site's instructional time each week in the second semester engaged in residency activities;
 - d. teacher preparation providers may seek approval to offer an innovative residency model that does not meet the minimum instructional time requirements but meets a specific workforce need and includes high-quality clinical experiences throughout the program and intensive clinical experiences throughout the residency year;
- 3. Out-of-State Residency Placement See Bulletin 996 for the description.
- 4. The residency shall include a combination of the following experiences:
 - a. instructional goal-setting and planning, including individual education plan (IEP) and individual accommodations plan (IAP) review and implementation;
 - b. classroom teaching;

- c. analysis of student assessment results, including formative and summative assessment data, student work samples, and observations of student class discussions;
- d. parent-teacher conferences and communication; and
- e. interactions and collaboration with other teachers.

CLINICAL EXPERIENCES FOR TEACHER PREPARATION PROGRAMS

ALTERNATIVE PROGRAMS (COMPLETER YEAR: 2019-20)

Effective January 1, 2017, the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE) issued a revised policy for institutions to require all alternate candidates to complete a one-year residency instead of previous Internship or Student Teaching requirements. The requirements for one-year residencies found in BESE Bulletin 996 (https://bese.louisiana.gov/policy) are listed below.

Minimum Requirements for Alternative Teacher Preparation Programs:

Programs must include the following practice experiences, which directly align with and sequentially develop the competencies identified in LAC 28:CXXXI (Bulletin 746).

- 1. Clinical experiences will be provided in classroom settings prior to the residency year as follows.
 - a. In all programs, a minimum of 9 credit hours or 135 contact hours of training is required prior to the residency.
- 2. A one-year residency shall take place in a public or approved non-public school in a classroom in the certification area. The residency shall include a combination of the following experiences:
 - a. instructional goal-setting and planning, including IEP and IAP review and implementation;
 - b. classroom teaching;
 - c. analysis of student assessment results, including formative and summative assessment data, student work samples, and observations of student class discussions;
 - d. parent-teacher conferences and communication; and
 - e. interactions and collaboration with other teachers.
- 3. One-Year Out-of-State Residencies see Bulletin 996 for information.
- 4. Supervision of Residency Experiences see Bulletin 996 for information.
- 5. <u>Practitioner teacher programs shall require candidates to complete the residency as a teacher of record</u>. Candidates must hold a valid practitioner teacher license pursuant to Bulletin 746.
- 6. <u>Master's degree or certification-only alternate programs shall allow candidates to</u> <u>complete the residency as a teacher of record or in a classroom under a teacher of record.</u>
 - a. candidates may complete the residency as a teacher of record and must hold a valid practitioner teacher license pursuant to Bulletin 746.
 - b. candidates may completed the one-year residency in a classroom in a public or approved non-public school in a classroom in the certification area with a teacher

of record who hold a valid teaching certificate in the area for which the candidate is pursuant certification pursuant to bulletin 746. The residency may include practice with other teachers in a public or approved non-public school setting. Residents placed in charter schools must be placed with a teacher of record who has demonstrated effectiveness pursuant to state law and Bulletin 130:

- i. effective July 1, 2018, candidates must hold a valid resident teacher certificate. The residency may include practice with other teachers in the public or approved non-public school setting;
- ii. for certification in PK-3, 1-5, or 1-5 integrated to merged, candidates must spend a minimum of 80 percent of the residency school site's instructional time each week engaged in residency activities; and
- iii. for certification in K-12, 4-8, 6-12, 4-8 integrated to merged or 6-12 integrated to merged, candidates must spend a minimum of 60 percent of the residency school site's instructional time each week in the first semester and 80 percent of the residency school site's instructional time each week in the second semester engaged in residency activities;
- iv. teacher preparation providers may seek approval to offer an innovative residency model that does not meet the minimum instructional time requirements but meets a specific workforce need and includes high-quality clinical experiences throughout the program and intensive clinical experiences throughout the residency year.

UNDERGRADUATE & ALTERNATE PROGRAMS (THREE-YEAR AVERAGES FOR ACADEMIC YEARS: 2017-18, 2018-19, 2020-21)

The Louisiana Department of Education states that Compass is Louisiana's educator support and evaluation system designed to provide all educators with regular, meaningful feedback on their performance.

Under this system, all teachers in public schools in Louisiana are evaluated annually using a four-tiered rating: Highly Effective, Effective: Proficient, Effective: Emerging, and Ineffective. Half of the evaluation is based on achievement student learning targets to generate the Compass Student Growth score, and half of the evaluation is based on observations by supervisors using the appropriate Compass rubric to generate a Compass Professional Practice score. The two scores are averaged to generate Compass Final Evaluation Scores that range from 1.00 to 4.00.

The results in the following tables represent new undergraduate and alternate teachers in grades K-12 for all certification areas. Scores are calculated for each academic year for Student Growth, Professional Practice, and Final Evaluation of all new teachers with less than two years of teaching experience. Individual new teacher scores are then linked to the teacher preparation programs that prepared them. Once scores are determined for each academic year for each teacher preparation program, an average is calculated for the three most recent academic years to create the tables in this document. The percentage of first- and second- year teachers who obtained scores in each of the four effectiveness levels after completing their programs are also identified for new teachers.

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The distribution table below identifies the labels assigned to teachers when they obtain Compass scores within the identified ranges for Student Growth, Professional Practice, and Final Evaluation.
