### **Discussion Items**

1. UCCC will create a process for changing the modes of instructions of any course.
2. UCCC decided that no proposals for change in course numbers will be entertained. Instead of changing the course#, a proposal for new course should be submitted.
3. A policy should be established to review the honors courses and curriculum. Currently any change to the honors program is only reviewed by the honors council. It was suggested that all changes to the honors curriculum should be approved by UCCC and then subsequently by Faculty Senate. This policy will have to be approved by the Faculty Senate.
4. All the generic statements about required sections of the syllabus will be added to the forms. The new forms will be published soon.
5. Department of Anthropology and Sociology will be merged effective July 2016. The courses and degrees will remain separate.
